

A FIRST LOOK AT OUR EDITORS' MOST EXCITING NEW WINES

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DIVERSE REDS AND WHITES FROM ACROSS THE WINE WORLD TAKE THE STAGE in this week's *Wine Spectator Insider*, with new releases from California, Italy and New Zealand, up to 96 points. This is a report of the most exciting wines our editors have discovered in the tasting room in recent weeks.

Cabernets and Merlots from Napa heavyweights Lewis, Adobe Road and Justin show off impressive fruit and complexity. Tuscan reds from revered producers Tenuta di Trinoro, Mazzei and Ornellaia deliver power and elegance. Pinot Noirs and Chardonnays from New Zealand leaders Two Paddocks and Kumeu River demonstrate the promise of this swiftly evolving region. TENUTA DI TRINORO

Toscana 2015

96 points | \$250 | 35 cases imported | Red

Alluring aromas of ripe cherry, black currant, violet and spice are shaded by coffee and cedar notes in this polished, sophisticated red. Intense, yet harmonious and expressive, evoking licorice, smoke and graphite elements on the long aftertaste. Cabernet Franc, Merlot, Cabernet Sauvignon and Petit Verdot. Best from 2020 through 2034. *From Italy.—B.S.*
